SAGE promotes "well-being" in addition to academic achievement, and aims to help gifted & talented (GT) students learn to self-advocate.

SAGE supports all GT students. We also recognize unique needs of three particular segments of our gifted population: twice-exceptional (2e), under-identified populations, and the highly gifted.

SAGE recognizes outstanding students and educators in our gifted community.

SAGE continues to build our solid network of involved and informed GT advocates.

Accomplishments

Supporting & advocating since 2010

SAGE has advocated for math telescoping, GT clustering, ASPIRE Academy inception & expansion, GT Specialists at every campus, above-level testing, flexible scheduling, curriculum changes to benefit GT students, funding for GT by the Texas Legislature, twice-exceptional learners, and training for educators who encounter GT students. Hundreds of students have been positively affected!

\$15K+ awarded in grants and scholarships

SAGE has funded on-site training and awarded grants to educators for professional learning. We've also given grants for school and classroom materials that support gifted students. We've awarded a \$1000 college scholarships to one graduating gifted student each year since 2016.

Nationally & locally known speakers
